Following several appeals for others to step up and join us we are now back up to a full complement of nine councillors, which will make sharing out the various responsibilities much easier. Our thanks and welcome aboard to the new recruits.

Parish Council Highlights

During this financial year The Council gave a Grant of £75 to Guide Dogs for the Blind for dog training, and £1000 to TRAC for maintenance of the play equipment.

With the help of funding from Tewkesbury Councillor Cate Cody we planted anoak tree on the Green in memory of our late Queen, and resurfaced part of a very muddy footpath from the end of Kilmore Lane.

You may also have noticed some Hedgehog warning signs around the village, designed by Twyning School.

We played our part in successfully fighting off the proposed housing development at Nut Orchard.

After many years of effort (mostly by Dave Luckett) Severn Trent are at last undertaking some major renovation works on our sewers. Some sections have been relined, others will be shortly.

Renovating most of the benches on The Green and elsewhere around the village. The Council negotiated the transfer of the carpark and easement over associated land at the top of Kilmore field to be used for parking in conjunction with sport on the field.

The Council carried out maintenance of trees and land around the parish and installed new litter bins where necessary.

The Council is trialling the use of large white rock parking barriers along the verges which may have to be extended to the Village Green.

The Summer term has been a busy one so far, with lots of things keeping us all very involved and active. Forest School sessions have been hugely enjoyed by all children. With the Kelly kettle whistling, the birds tweeting and the sound of children laughing regularly being heard during these sessions. The children have made paint using natural resources such as leaves and petals and little hedgehogs were made by using Play-Doh and small twigs.

We have been learning about growing our own food this term with lettuce, potatoes, carrots and strawberry plants being planted and cared for by the children. Potato salad was made in one to cooking sessions and each child taking theirs home to try. The strawberries are growing well-many of the children are showing great interest in them, especially now they are turning red. Lots of children were keen to try our first crop of lettuce and all enjoyed a taste test. Borad beans were planted in sessions and taken home. We have loved seeing photos of how well they are growing!

Our well established links with Twyning School ensure that our pre-schoolers have regular contact with their new reception teacher: Mrs Abell. The children visit the class and enjoy hearing stories while having a taste of their new surroundings in September. We are also looking forward to our end of year trip to Little Owl Farm Park, Pre-School graduation, end of year party and a special performance of the year 5 and 6 play "The Greatest Showman" to watch at Twyning School.

Freecycle Saturday

Keeping Items Out Of Landfill Next Dates For 2024

Many thanks to all those who have taken part in any of the previous Freecycle Saturdays and I hope for those that did it is proving to continue to be a generally worthwhile activity.

Each time that we organise one of these events more and more people are leaving items out for anyone to take away which is really great news as by doing so we are all managing to keep increasing numbers of items out of landfill.

As a result, it is intended to keep the momentum going and the following are the dates for the remaining Freecycle Saturdays in 2024:

- 3rd August
- 5th October

For those who are new to Twyning or who have not previously taken part, Freecycle Saturday is a really simple initiative that aims to keep as many items as possible out of landfill.

To get involved you might want to find a corner for a small Freecycle Saturday box where you can keep out of the way all those items that you no longer need but somebody else might be able to use.

Big or small items it really doesn't matter. Items could include books, software installation or music CDs, stationary, A4 folders or box files, old crockery or kitchen utensils, spare tote or other bags, unused nuts & screws or ironmongery, old tech devices or mobile phones (even if they are broken!) and even the original boxes they came in, any old tools or other items sitting unused or unwanted in your shed, camping equipment, your old curtains, even small items of furniture – absolutely anything that someone else might be able to fix, use or repurpose.

There are no rules except keeping stuff out of the bin and landfill. Once you have your items ready all you need to do is leave them at the end of your drive after 9:00am on the next Freecycle Saturday date for anyone to take away. It really doesn't matter if you only have one item or hundreds.

Also, I will be posting reminders nearer each date on the village noticeboards and on the Twyning Facebook page so I hope that even more people will take part this year.

Twyning School



After nearly six years we were overdue an Ofsted inspection and, like most schools in this situation, staff and governors were awaiting the call. A two day inspection took place in mid April and was extremely thorough, yet a very positive experience. I am absolutely delighted to let you know that the overall judgement was good with two of the five key areas being outstanding. The inspectors were particularly impressed with the

behaviour and attitude of the children. When they debriefed the governors and leadership team on the day of the inspection, they couldn't stop talking about how amazingthe pupils were.

Everyone is very proud of this achievement. Huge thanks go to Miss Gladstone for her strong leadership over the last four years and I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate and thank our wonderful staff, pupils, governors and families who all had a part to play in sharing how great our school is.

As we move through the summer term, there's a lot happening. Our Year 6 children took their SATs exams in mid May, followed by a residential trip for Years 5 and 6 to the Pioneer Centre, Cleobury Mortimer. Children participated in climbing, abseiling, zip wire, high ropes, challenge course, caving, archery, raft building and a beautiful evening walk in the Wyre forest. We are so proud of the children, some of whom faced their fear of heights and challenged themselves to their limit. We are now looking forward to the next residential with Years 3 and 4 to Noah's Ark Children's Venture, Macaroni Wood, near Cirencester. As always at this time of the year, preparations and rehearsals are underway for the end of year performance by Year 5 and 6 children. This year: 'The Greatest Showman'. What a fantastic finalé for our leavers!

We are always keen to hear from members of the wider community who wish to support the school as a governor. Governors who do not have students at the school often have a different perspective we greatly welcome. You do not need to have a background in education, in fact governing a school needs expertise in finance, premises, HR as well as hundreds of other areas, so the more diverse our team the better. We do currently have a vacancy for a non-parent governor and would welcome anyone keen to give a little back to one of the key areas of our community. Finally, our school dog Peggy retired at half-term. She has done the most wonderful job for a long time now, meeting the children as they arrive at school in the morning and spending time with them throughout the day. The last few months in Cubs have seen us move from the dreary days of winter to the first evenings of summer – but none of that has dampened spirits or prevented us getting outside or having fun.

The early part of the year saw the Cubs earn their Environmental Conservation badges – building on the work put in last year to build birdboxes, we learnt about different types of energy, ways to save energy and water, and designed posters to encourage everyone to adopt similar habits – the fantastic results of which can be seen below! Unfortunately we haven't been able to put the birdboxes up at TRAC as Akela was ill on the planned day – these will be going up before summer.



We then moved onto more practical skills, learning what to do in an emergency at home for the Home Safety badge, then improving navigation and map reading skills so everyone in the pack has the Navigator badge level 2 - the Cubs then put these skills to use navigating around the village (in possibly the muddiest conditions imaginable....). These navigations skills will be important for the big adventure of the Evolution camp later in the year, so well done Cubs.

After Easter we've taken advantage of the brief sunny period to spend a couple of weeks doing team-building games on the Green and at TRAC – chasing pegs and Cluedo clues. After half term we will be doing lots of preparation for our two nights away with thousands of other Cubs and Brownies at Evolution camp – more hiking, setting up camp and cooking on fires – so don't be surprised if you see more Cubs wondering around the Village.


